If you are staying in the United States for a long period of time you might want to open a bank account. You should request a letter from the administration office on the 4th floor. The letter will be available 24 hours after you have requested it. Please submit your full name and local address to the office.

You will need at least two of the following items to open a bank account:

- 1. Passport and I-20
- Student I.D., major credit card, a U.S. driver's license or a Massachusetts I.D.
- 3. Social security number if you have one.
